What is the Homeless Education Liaison Program?



McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Liaison Program (HELP) is a federally

funded partnership between IYS, both County and City school districts, and the Oregon Department of Education. The goal of HELP is to remove barriers to education for all homeless and at-risk youth, ensuring the right to a fair education, despite lack of residence. Our HELP Team works with social service community agencies, schools, and other community partners to ensure the success of all homeless youth in Klamath County. HELP operates concurrently with each school year beginning in mid-August.

Did you know...

IYS has a federally funded program to assist all school aged youth in Klamath County experiencing homelessness succeed at home and in their education?

IYS's Homeless Education Liaison Program (HELP), identified 750 Kids in County and City schools as homeless or at risk of being homeless.

Over 20% of High School graduates were without permanent residence for over 4 years according to the NCHE

All students in Klamath County who lack a regular, adequate, nighttime residence qualify for

McKinney-Vento, a program designed to remove barriers to education and participation in school as a direct result of being homeless. The goal of this program is to help school aged youth lacking a permanent residence maintain their academic success, inform about educational rights, and connect to vital and important services such as health care, food needs, educational assistance, school-base extracurricular activities, Transportation to and from school, shelter and housing services, and any other services necessary for success. IYS **HELP** Liaisons collaborate with each school district and multiple other community agencies to reach youth who would benefit from our services.

Youth can receive clothing, school supplies, hygiene, and other necessities from IYS's clothing closet. IYS also partners with Goodwill to for vouchers when clothing needs exceed IYS's stock.

Each year, IYS is a distribution site for Coats for Kids during the winter. This is not just for McKinney Vento, but a way to keep all children warm during the cold months. HELP begins taking appointments for families in late August, before school starts, and runs the entire length of the school year.
